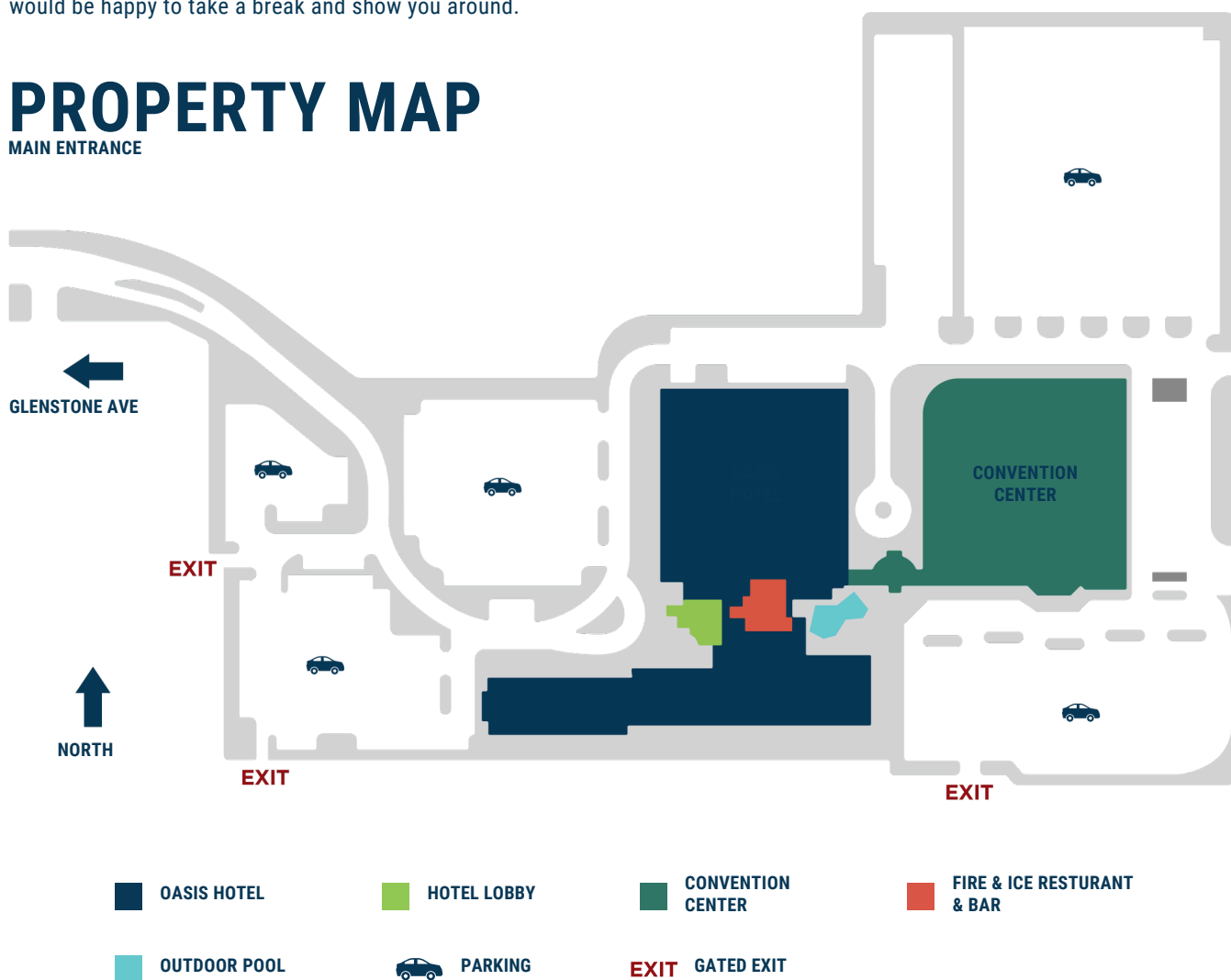

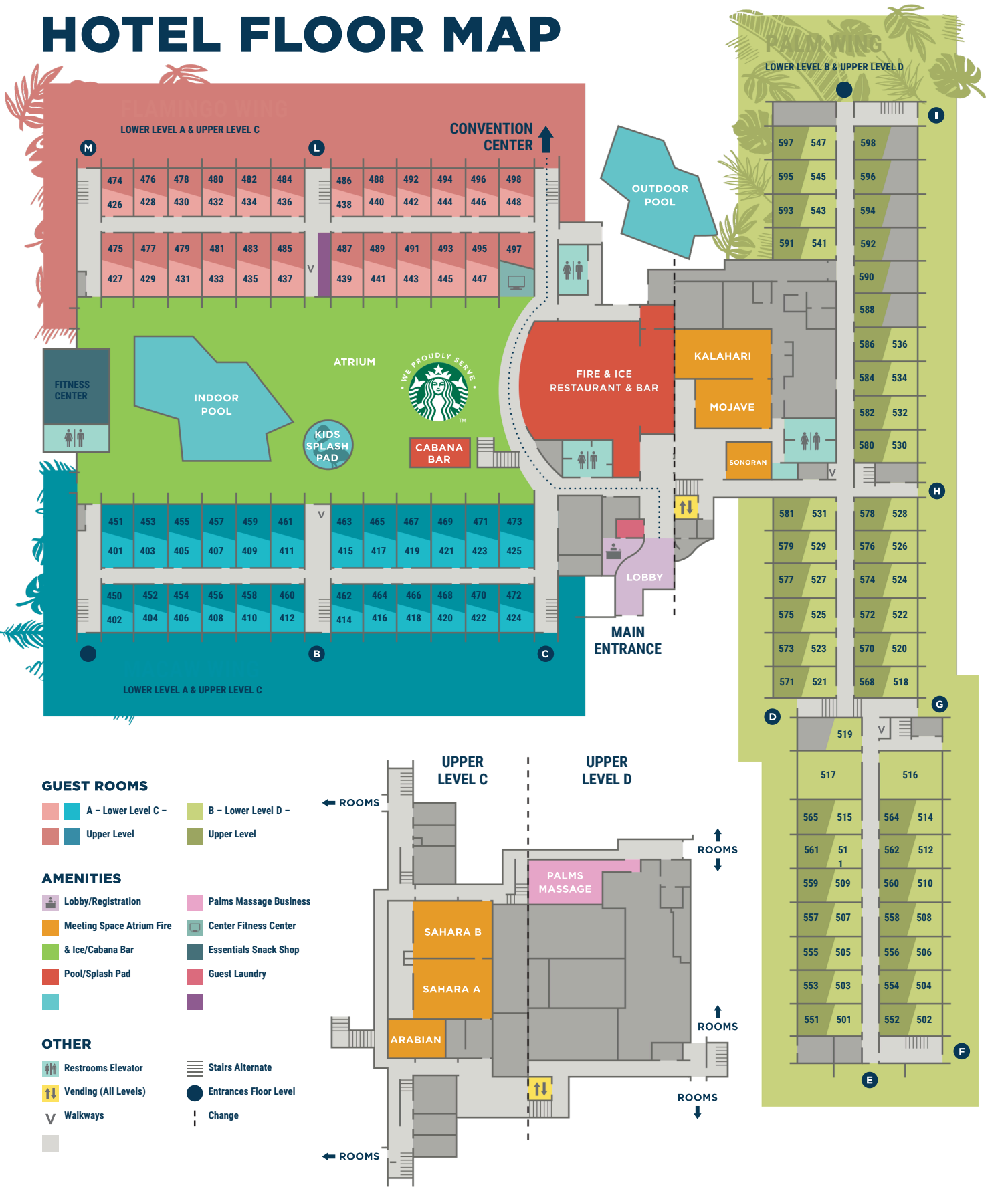

2025 AWARD WINNERS

Administrator of the Year Award - Jill Huntsman, MCCTA/Administration, Director of Hillyard Technical Center

The MoACTE Administrator of the Year Award recognizes administrative CTE professionals at the school, district, county, state or federal level who have demonstrated leadership in ensuring teacher and student success and have made significant contributions toward innovative, unique and effective career and technical education programs. Receiving this award for 2025 is Jill Huntsman.



Jill's dedication to Career and Technical Education began at age eight when she joined the Clark Helping Hands 4H club. She continued her journey at Moberly Area Technical Center, studying Agriculture Education, and later earned a degree in Agriculture Education from the University of Missouri- Columbia. In 1995, she launched the Agriculture Education program at South Holt High School, including chartering the South Holt FFA. Jill then taught at Hillyard Technical Center in St. Joseph for 13 years before transitioning into administration. As Director, she led two expansions, a building renovation, and the addition of four new programs. Under her leadership, Hillyard's Registered Youth Apprenticeship grew to 30 industry partners and 70 students. Jill has been an active leader in numerous professional organizations, including the Missouri Vocational Agriculture Teachers Association and Missouri Council of Career and Technical Center Administrators, throughout her 30 year career in CTE.

Dean is the Agriculture Education Teacher and FFA Advisor at New Bloomfield High School, bringing 16 years of experience to the classroom. After a successful career in retail management, automotive service writing, and agricultural equipment sales, Dean decided to pursue his passion for teaching and returned to college to earn a degree in Agriculture Education. While balancing full-time work and studies, he achieved his goal of becoming an Agriculture Educator, teaching at Chamois, Russellville, and New Bloomfield High School in Central Missouri. In addition to his teaching career, Dean is a fifth generation farmer, raising purebred Simmental cattle and Quarter Horses on his family farm. Married to his wife, Cyndi, for 19 years, Dean is dedicated to inspiring his students and fostering a deep appreciation for agriculture. His commitment to the field has earned him the 2024 Missouri Outstanding Agriculture Education Teacher award and recognition as the leader of Missouri's 2022 Outstanding Secondary Agricultural Education Program.

Angeleic is the President of MTTA and Chairperson of the Criminal Justice Instructors of Missouri, with a rich 25 year career as a police officer, dispatcher, and court supervisor. She has mentored future educators through the DESE Skilled Technical Sciences Mentor/ Protege Program and presented at the 2024 ACTE Vision Conference. Outside of work, Angeleic enjoys spending time with her family.

Teacher Educator of the Year Award - Debra Price- Scheppmann, MOEFCS, Missouri State University

This award recognizes CTE teacher educators who have demonstrated innovation and leadership in teacher preparation, professional development, and a commitment to preparing teachers to deliver high quality within CTE programs. Receiving this award for the 2025 year is Debra Price- Scheppmann.



Debra has been dedicated to the field of Family and Consumer Sciences Education since the beginning of her career. After teaching at Walnut Grove High School and Nevada High School, she became a Teacher Educator at Missouri State University in 2012. She has served on the MoEFCS Board of Directors for 13 years and has developed several special topics courses, including the Hospitality and Tourism Industry courses to prepare teachers for DESE's new Introduction to Hospitality course. Debra has also worked closely with Missouri FCCLA, offering student opportunities to interact with regional and state leaders and organizing a reality simulation for over 300 students annually. Recently, she launched an Accelerated Master's program to help undergraduate students fast-track their graduate degrees, supporting the growth of dual credit opportunities in FCS programs. Passionate about CTE, Debra continues to make significant contributions to the development and success of future educators in the field.

Outside of the classroom, Scott enjoys working on the family farm, mentoring new teachers, and supporting local 4-H and FFA members.
